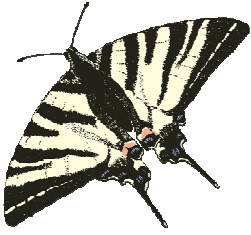

Mull species lists and trip report, 26th May to 1st June 2011

#	DATE	LOCATIONS & NOTES
1	26 th May	Tobermory with botanical cliff walk. Heard wood warbler well.
2	27 th May	Otter watch am. 2 seen. Loch Frisa Eagle Watch, then to Loch Na Keal – saw white-tailed eagle fly out and take a fish from the loch. Walk on Ulva in continuous rain. Many of the plants and trees burnt brown and shredded by the gales and sea spray of last week. Then to Am Birlinn Restaurant.
3	28 st May	Otter watch am. 3 seen. Torosay and Duart Castle visit, then to Loch Buie standing stones and walk to beach. Superb views of short-eared owl. Weather mixed.
4	29 nd May	Otter watch am. 4 seen. Two separate buses with stand-in guides. Visited Dervaig Church and walked beside reed bed. Windy with showers. Calgary gallery for lunch followed by walk through woods and a sand-blasting on the dunes. Found sword-leaved helleborine. Wonderful views of golden eagle stooping and white-tailed eagle nearby. Then to white-tailed eagle nest by Loch Scridain – saw eagle at nest with two chicks. Also had lovely views of a great northern diver in summer plumage.
5	30 th May	Otter watch am. None seen – tide low. To Iona via Lake Assapol. Nice pigs but few birds there. Heard corncrakes well on Iona – and at least one person saw one. Lovely day! White-tailed eagles displaying in Glen More on return, high over crags in full sun.
6	31 st May	Otter watch am. None seen. Boat trip to Staffa and Iona. Beautiful day!! Amazing views of Fingal's Cave, grey seals, fulmars, kittiwakes, puffins, guillemots, razorbills, manx shearwaters, gannets and skuas. Outstanding trip, much enjoyed by all, with the bonus of another otter on the way back.
7	1 st June	Stopped at Garmony Point on way to ferry. Raining and blowing again!

Notes:

This was an amazingly successful week, with a knowledgeable and enthusiastic group. The weather was less extreme than the previous week, with only one continuously wet day. We had fantastic views of otters, mostly in Salen Bay, including a pair of cubs, a dog otter and a female - fishing, playing and grooming on and around the small islands (10 sightings in all). Views of the eagles were remarkable and inspiring and it was good to hear about individual birds we had seen from David Sexton (RSPB) in the evening. The travellers included some keen botanists and we managed to add some species to the plant list from the previous week. The day on Staffa and Lunga was an excellent finale.
